Artificial Intelligence in Nursing Education and Research: A Four-Part Webinar Series

Artificial intelligence (AI) is rapidly reshaping how knowledge is created, accessed, interpreted, and applied across education, research, and health care. For nurse educators and researchers, these developments bring both significant opportunities and important questions related to teaching, learning, scholarship, professional responsibility, and the future of nursing.

This four-part webinar series will provide participants with a foundation for understanding AI, explore how AI is currently being taken up in nursing education and nursing research, and create space for critical dialogue about how the profession might engage with AI thoughtfully and responsibly.

Facilitator:



The webinar series will be facilitated by Dr. Nassim Adhami, Assistant Professor of Teaching at the University of British Columbia School of Nursing. Dr. Adhami is a PhD-prepared nurse educator whose teaching and educational scholarship focus on supporting meaningful and inclusive learning within nursing education.

Her program of educational research explores the theory-to-practice bridge in nursing education, Universal Design for Learning (DUL) and the use of AI in nursing education. An emerging area of her scholarship examines the intersections of nursing practice, UDL, and AI, with particular attention to how evolving technologies can be thoughtfully and responsibly integrated into nursing education while supporting learning, accessibility, clinical reasoning, and the preparation of nurses for contemporary practice.

Webinar # 1: Understanding the AI Landscape

The first webinar will establish a shared foundation for understanding AI. Participants will explore what AI is, how it has evolved over time, and the different forms of AI that are increasingly influencing nursing education and research.

Topics will include the history and evolution of AI, and key terminology and types of AI. The session will also consider the broader social and professional context in which these technologies are developing.
